Blessed are you who fear the Lord. — Psalm 128:1a

First Reading - The woman who fears the Lord is to be praised.

Second Reading - Brothers and sisters, you are children of the light.

Gospel - Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities.

USE IT OR LOSE IT

The parable in today's Gospel is about talents. Talents in Jesus' time were heavy silver weights, each worth a large amount of money. Today we define talents as our God-given abilities. By either definition, talents are there for a purpose—to be used. As Jesus' story shows, money has no value if it is simply buried. How many of us acquire possessions, squirreling them away like pack rats? Our abilities are just as useless if we never put them to work. Talents. Do you know what yours are? Our talents are not the skills or knowledge we have acquired, or our experience of life. Talents are those special aptitudes that are unique to each person. Some of us know what those talents are and use them to the fullest; some know some of theirs and use them now and again. Many more have little understanding of what real strengths God has endowed them with, or how to use them for good. Not long ago a scientist set up an experiment. She matched people recently diagnosed with multiple sclerosis with people who had had the same illness longer. She expected to see that each of the newlydiagnosed would show an improved outlook from the help of their new "buddy," and this proved true. But surprisingly, the outlook of the helpers improved even more dramatically. Just the listening and befriending made all the difference. So think carefully about what your true abilities and aptitudes are and put them to use, whether for welcoming, spreading joy, making peace, healing, or comforting.

Urge Legislators to Oppose NJ Reproductive Freedom Act (\$3030/A4848)

On October 8, 2020, The Reproductive Freedom Act (RFA) S3030 was introduced in the New Jersey State Senate and was referred to the Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee. If passed, the RFA would codify into New Jersey law the findings of Roe v. Wade, meaning that abortion would remain legal in New Jersey even if the case were overturned by the Supreme Court. The RFA would also strip safeguards and regulations on the abortion procedure, making New Jersey a more dangerous place for women and their unborn babies.

Every year, the scriptures read during the Liturgy of the Word (the first part of the Mass) tell the story of salvation by revolving around the events of Jesus' life -from birth to the Resurrection. The church teaches that Jesus Christ is present among the faithful through His Word. The church year begins the first Sunday of Advent and ends the Sunday before the next Advent with the celebration of Christ the King. The reading you hear each week corresponds to the season-Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, Lent, Easter and Ordinary Time once again. The readings are used on a 3-year cycle: Year A (2020) focuses on the Gospel of Matthew; Year B (2021) focuses on the Gospel of Mark; and the Year C (2022) focuses of the Gospel of Luke. The Gospel of John is primarily during Advent and Christmas, Lent and Easter. The first reading is usually taken from the Old Testament; the second from an epistle or the Book of Revelation. These are also on a three year cycle and all Catholic Churches throughout the world hear the same readings each Sunday.
