Your ways, O LORD, make known to me; teach me your paths. — Psalm 25:4

<u>First Reading</u> - I will set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth.

<u>Second Reading</u> - The water of the flood prefigured baptism, which saves you now.

<u>**Gospel**</u> - Jesus was tempted by Satan, and the angels ministered to him.

REPENT AND BELIEVE IN THE GOSPEL

Lent is the time of year we devote to scrutinizing our lives in the light of our baptism into the death and resurrection of Jesus. Today's readings are a short catechism of what our baptized lives mean. As Noah passed through the waters of the flood to a covenant with God, so did we enter into a covenant, a promised relationship with God through our baptism.

Peter's letter gives an explicit explanation of what our baptism means: it is an appeal we make to God for a clear conscience. How do we obtain this clear conscience? The words proclaimed by Jesus immediately following his temptation show us the way: "Repent, and believe in the gospel" (Mark 1:15). It might be a good spiritual exercise to keep these readings before us throughout the entire season of Lent, a means to help us return to a life lived by our baptismal promises.

IS LENT

A SEASON OF SUBTRACTION OR ADDITION? Lent is a time of self-denial and many Catholics give up something they enjoy during Lent. Lent can also be a time of addition - taking on something good; perhaps more service, faith study or worship.

5 RS FOR LENT:

<u>Reflection</u>: Lent is a time for self-examination when we can take a spiritual inventory of our lives. Does God have first place with us for do we have other higher priorities?

<u>Repentance</u>. Our self-examination should turn up areas of our life that we need to turn over to God. Repentance begins with reflection, continues with confession of our sins to God, and concludes with us leaving our sins and turning back to God.

<u>Reformation</u>: Once we have reflected and repented, God is willing to reform our lives in His image. God the Holy Spirit works within all those who have received Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord, turning our wills towards God's will for us

<u>**Renewal:**</u> As God reforms our lives we are inwardly renewed by the Holy Spirit.

<u>Resurrection</u>: This is the greatest promise of Lent. The season of Lent leads into the season of Easter. Casting out the death of evil and sin, we are reformed in God's image, renewed by His Spirit, and resurrected to new life in Jesus Christ.

Whatever you do this Lent, use the season as a time of deepening. Whether you add or subtract during Lent, make it your goal to go deeper into the life of God.
