The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

**FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION:**

Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

**PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:** Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

**PARISH REGISTRATION:** Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. ## **Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time October 3, 2021**

*Let the children come to me; do not prevent them,  
for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these.  
— Mark 10:14*

**First Reading** - The man said, "This one is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called 'woman'."

**Second Reading** - He who consecrates and those who are being consecrated all have one origin.

**Gospel** - Whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it.

### **EQUAL BEFORE GOD**

In today's Gospel Jesus says the basic law from the beginning is that all human beings were created equal in the image of God. Thus, a man and woman in marriage have equality and a fullness that is expressed in their relationship with each other. (In speaking against divorce, Jesus is actually protective of women, who at that time could be divorced by their husbands, but could not obtain a divorce themselves.) The disciples attempt to keep some children and their parents from disturbing Jesus, probably thinking that women and children were not important enough to disturb the Master! Jesus is indignant at their lack of understanding. For him, the children and their parents have as much right to be with him as anyone else. In fact, he looks at the children gathered around him and says that they are the example that self-important people should imitate. He embraces and blesses them. Young children, in general, accept the rules of life without questioning every little detail. They are open to the love of their parents and trust that rules are imposed for their well-being, even if they do not fully understand them. We are offered the gift of faith by a loving Father. Jesus is asking us to be child-like, not childish, in accepting this gift in simplicity and trust. Learning and discussing issues of faith are fine, but we cannot stop there. Since we do not earn faith—it is freely given to us—we are called to express this faith in how we live our lives. We are equal in God's sight and equally responsible to live up to our calling.

**St. Thérèse of Lisieux,  
St. Teresa of the Child Jesus or the  
Little Flower,**

born January 2, 1873, died September  
30, 1897; canonized May 17, 1925;  
feast day October 1, a Carmelite  
nun whose service to her order, alt-

hough outwardly unremarkable, was later recog-  
nized for its exemplary spiritual accomplishments.  
She was named a doctor of the church by Pope John  
Paul II in 1997.

She is the patron saint of missions and of florists.  
Thérèse was the youngest of nine children, five of  
whom survived childhood. After her mother died  
of breast cancer in 1877, Thérèse moved with her  
family to Lisieux. In the deeply religious atmos-  
phere of her home, her piety developed early and  
intensively. All four of her elder sisters be-  
came nuns, and at the age of 15 she entered the Car-  
melite convent at Lisieux, having been refused ad-  
mission a year earlier. Although she suffered  
from depression, a causeless feeling of guilt, reli-  
gious doubts, she kept the rule to perfection and  
maintained a smiling, pleasant, and unselfish man-  
ner. Before her death from tuberculosis, she  
acknowledged that not one day had ever passed  
without a struggle. Her burial site at Lisieux became  
a place of pilgrimage, and a basilica bearing her  
name was built there (1929-54).
