**MARRIAGES:** Specific time is set for the celebration of marriage on Saturdays. The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

**FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION:**

Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

**PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:** Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

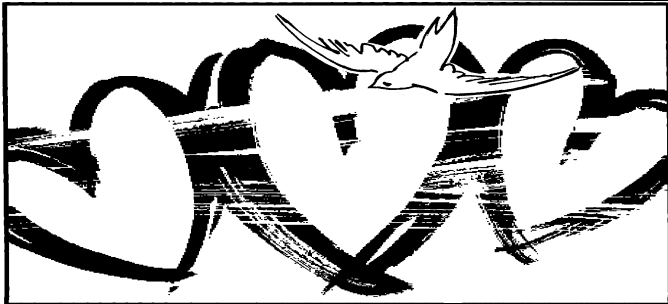

*You shall love the Lord, your God,

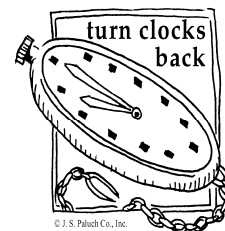

**First Saturday Devotions  
November 6, 2021**

In honor of the Blessed Mother's request to Sr. Lucia,  
who she appeared to at Fatima, St. Mary of Czestochowa  
offers the opportunity to partake in the devotion of the  
Five First Saturdays.

On the first Saturday of each month, the Holy Sacrifice of  
the Mass is offered at 8:30 am, followed by the recitation  
of the rosary and 15 minutes of quiet meditation on the  
mysteries. The intention of this devotion is to make repa-  
ration for the offenses and blasphemies against the Im-  
maculate Heart of Mary. Confession, which is a require-  
ment, may be made within 8 days prior or after the first  
Saturday.

The promise to those who console the Virgin Mary  
through this devotion is the assistance at the hour of death  
with the graces necessary for their salvation. The Blessed  
Mother also promised that this devotion will result in the  
salvation of souls and peace in the world.

**All Saints Day**

Some people think holy people are those who have vi-  
sions, who speak in tongues or have the stigmata. But  
none are true signs that the person possessing them is  
truly holy. True holiness is not about extraordinary ex-  
ternal signs, but about an extraordinary interior love.  
Each Beatitude begins with the word "Blessed" and each  
speaks about some area of human life: poverty of spirit,  
meekness, suffering, mercy and interior peace. The  
Grace brought about by Baptism makes us God's chil-  
dren; and as God's children, we have the inheritance of  
heaven. True sanctity on earth is cleaving to God by  
love in every moment and every day life.  
Finding sanctity in ordinary life is difficult for most peo-  
ple because it demands constant surrender to Grace. But  
we are not alone; we have the aid of the community of  
all the saints in heaven who have no designated feast or  
who may not even be canonized. On All Saints Day we  
celebrate the feast of all those who have so loved God.  
We ask their intercessions. They are our companions in  
seeing ordinary life from God's point of view. They are  
the true children of God who have purified themselves  
and tried to be as pure as Christ. They are the blessed  
who have lived the Beatitudes and allowed the Holy  
Spirit to help them see everyday actions from God's  
point of view.
