MARRIAGES: Specific time is set for the celebration of marriage on Saturdays. The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION:

Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

PARISH REGISTRATION: Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. Please call or stop by the Parish office to complete a registration form. We should also be notified if your address has changed or if you are leaving the parish..

THE CENTER OF A MEANINGFUL LIFE

Today's readings invite us to reflect upon some of life's deepest questions, and to explore the meaning of faith. We hear of the universal human search for meaning in our lives in the book of Ecclesiastes. In Luke's Gospel, we hear Jesus' parable about one who foolishly seeks ultimate security through the accumulation of wealth. In Colossians, faith in the crucified and resurrected Christ is proclaimed as the path to a richly purposeful and meaningful life. The path of Christian faith places our work, our sufferings, and our limitations within the larger picture of God's purposes for all of us. In Jesus, God is revealed as our companion in human suffering and limitation. God's love is at the center of a meaningful life. We place our trust in this loving God, who created us to share in this love, and to share this love.

**First Saturday Devotions
August 6, 2022**

In honor of the Blessed Mother's request to Sr. Lucia,
whom she appeared to at Fatima,
St. Mary of Czestochowa offers the opportunity to partake
in the devotion of the Five First Saturdays.
On the first Saturday of each month, the Holy Sacrifice of
the Mass is offered at 8:30 am, followed by the recitation
of the rosary and 15 minutes of quiet meditation on the
mysteries. The intention of this devotion is to make repa-
ration for the offenses and blasphemies against the Im-
maculate Heart of Mary. Confession, which is a require-
ment, may be made within 8 days prior or after the first
Saturday.

The promise to those who console the Virgin Mary
through this devotion is the assistance at the hour of death
with the graces necessary for their salvation. The Blessed
Mother also promised that this devotion will result in the
salvation of souls and peace in the world.

"Courage" is a group for men and women who experi-
ence same-sex attractions and who have made a commit-
ment to strive for chastity. They are inspired by the Gos-
pel call to holiness and the Catholic Church's beautiful
teachings about the goodness and inherent purpose of
human sexuality. Through this Apostolate, people who
experience same-sex attraction receive pastoral support
in the form of spiritual guidance, community prayer sup-
