<u>First Reading</u> - Because Moses interceded, the Lord relented and did not punish the people.

Second Reading - Paul expresses his gratitude for being appointed to the ministry.

Gospel - There is great rejoicing in heaven when a sinner repents.

Reflection

Since today's readings teach us many things, perhaps it's a good idea to try to focus on just one: obstinacy. The angry God we encounter in Exodus is upset because the people are so obstinate, so thick! They just don't get it. God has rescued them, fed them, led them, made covenant with them, and there they are bowing down before some bovine. The God we meet in the Letter to Timothy is the God who turned the stiff-necked Pharisee Saul/ Paul's head once and for all. The God we meet in the Gospel acts contrary to conventional housekeeping, animal husbandry, and parental rights. This God is telling us not to be so thick, so stiff-necked, so tough on others. God forgives the Israelites even after they blatantly break the first law of the Decalogue. God forgives Paul even though he has ruthlessly persecuted the Christ. God forgives the repentant sinner, no matter how prodigal that forgiveness may seem to those who want to condemn. God forgives the stiff-necked, the obstinate, the thick, the sinner. Lucky for the stiff-necked, the obstinate, the thick, and the sinners. Lucky for us.
