MARRIAGES: Specific time is set for the celebration of marriage on Saturdays. The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION:

Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

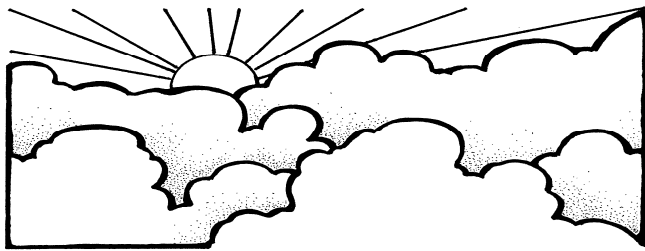

Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time October 30, 2022

*The Lord lifts up all who are falling
and raises up all who are bowed down.
— Psalm 145:14*

First Reading - Lord, you love all things that exist.

Second Reading - May the name of Christ be glorified in you and you in him .

Gospel - Zacchaeus, a tax collector, considered to be a sinner, is converted to the Lord.

A Reflection of Today's Gospel

Today's Gospel is a simple story of Jesus and a man of short stature named Zacchaeus. Zacchaeus is a rich tax collector who wants to see who this Jesus is, but he gets lost in the crowd and wonders how Jesus can love him who is lost. He is also short in stature and wonders how Jesus can love him by being so short. So Zacchaeus climbs up a sycamore tree to see Jesus. But that is not enough for Jesus. When Jesus reaches the tree, he calls Zacchaeus and says, "Come down quickly; for today I must stay at your house." Jesus takes the initiative, essentially to reach out to Zacchaeus to enter his home— his life. This illustrates the point and purpose of the spiritual life: that God would dwell within us, and from within transform us. This is the point of listening to God in the Liturgy of the Word at the Holy Mass: to come down from our own self-regard and allow Jesus to enter our home-our soul- in order to transform us from within through the grace of the Eucharist in Holy Communion. Going further, Jesus offers Zacchaeus hope. Zacchaeus knew he was coming up short in life, but he didn't know if Jesus would offer him what he was lacking. Jesus responds, "The Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost." The human soul was lost in Zacchaeus' life. He admits that his way of life has been dishonest and admits to his humility.

As we grow older, we also grow wiser. With that wisdom we might see that our mistakes are often God's opportunities to enter our "house" or our Soul.
