Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

**FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION:**

Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

**PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK:** Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

**PARISH REGISTRATION:** Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. ## **Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time November 6, 2022**

*"The Lord is not God of the dead, but of the living,  
for to him all are alive."*

**First Reading** - The King of the world will raise us up to live again forever.

**Second Reading** - May the Lord encourage and strengthen your hearts.

**Gospel** - Those who are deemed worthy of the coming age can no longer die.

In today's Gospel, we hear about an encounter between Jesus and some Sadducees. They were literal interpreters of the written Law of Moses, which means that they were in disagreement with the position of the Pharisees, who offered an oral interpretation of the Law of Moses. The Sadducees are described as opponents to the belief in resurrection. If a man died without producing an heir, the man's brother should marry his wife and the offspring of this union would inherit the property and carry on the name of the man who had died. Jesus argues from the same written Law of Moses to show that there is resurrection. Using the texts from the Book of Exodus that describe Moses' encounter with God in the burning bush, Jesus shows that God is the God of the living, not the dead. The Sadducees argued against resurrection because of the limits of earthly existence. They did not imagine another possibility for existence and relationship with God. Jesus proposes that the possibilities of resurrected life are beyond our imaginations. Jesus' conclusion suggests something else as well: To spend time worrying about resurrected life is to miss the point. The point is eternal relationship with God is possible, for God is the God of the living, "... for to him all are alive."

**History of Forty Hours Devotion in the United States**

St. John Neumann was the first church leader in America  
to practice the devotion. At the time, Catholics faced  
great opposition in his home city of Philadelphia during  
the Know-Nothing Riots of 1844. Anti-Catholic protest-  
ers burned two churches and continued to foster animos-  
ity towards the Catholics in the city.

Bishop Neumann wanted to institute 40 Hours Devotion,  
but some of the priests in the diocese were hesitant, be-  
lieving that it might fan the flames of anti-Catholic senti-  
ment and even result in the desecration of the Eucharist.  
Neumann was working late into the night when he fell  
asleep at his desk with his candle still lit. As he slept, the  
candle burnt down and caught the papers on his desk.

Miraculously, he awoke before a large fire broke out —  
and the papers, though charred, were still readable.  
Neumann thanked God for His protection and the Lord  
spoke to him, telling him to not fear about having the  
devotion. The first was held in St. Philip Neri Parish,  
and then expanded throughout the diocese and beyond,  
being approved for all American dioceses in 1866.
