The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION: Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

PARISH REGISTRATION: Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. Please call or stop by the Parish office to complete a registration form. We should also be notified if your address has changed or if you are leaving the parish.

First Reading: Ezekiel 33:7-9 - God has appointed the prophet as a watchman over his people. If he fails to give them warning against sin, he will be held responsible.

<u>Second Reading</u>: Romans 13:8-10 - In this beautiful letter, Paul says that all commandments are contained in this: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Gospel: Matthew 18:15-20 - Jesus explains to his disciples how to respond to those who wrong them – with gentleness and practical wisdom. He promises that whenever "two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst."

Reflection

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that we are committed to one another and that we are responsible for the good of all people. Eash of us is responsible for the others salvation. We sometimes forget these things. All to often, we feel that our hands are full just getting ourselves and our loved ones to heaven. But there is no mistaking the message: Love your neighbor as yourself; and speak up against sin.

How do we do these two things at the same time? We tend towards arrogance when we are the ones who are right and quick to correct someone who is wrong. We are challenged to do two things in that situation. First, we need to humbly look into our own heart and see our own faults. Second we need to ask ourselves if it is possible that we are wrong and not the other person. If, we are certain that the other person is doing something wrong, then we need to confront him/her in a loving manner.

We must remember to separate the sinfulness and respect the person as our brother and sister in Christ; but it will involve mutual respect and acceptance, along with a prayer for each other. True love will seek to constantly call forth the best in us and the ones we love.

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

On 13 September 335, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher (also called the Church of the Resurrection) was dedicated. The following day, the cross that Empress Helena had discovered on 14 September 320, was venerated in a solemn ceremony. In 614, the Persian King, Chosroes II, waged war on the Romans. After conquering Jerusalem, he confiscated many treasures, among which was the Cross of Jesus. The Byzantine emperor Heraclius initiated peace negotiations, but was rejected. He then waged war and won near Nineveh, asking for the restitution of the Cross, which then returned to Jerusalem. Today, the cruelty of the Cross is not what is exalted, but the Love that God manifested to humanity by accepting death on the Cross: "Who, though in the form of God, emptied himself, taking the form of a slave. This is the glory of the Cross of Jesus!" (Pope Francis) (Vatican News)

The Feast of the Most Holy Name of Mary

The Most Holy Name of Mary originated in Spain in the sixteenth century. In 1683, Pope Innocent XI extended the feast day to the universal Church and gave it the September 12th date. The date is significant because it marks a battle victory for Christian Europe against the Muslim Turks. The Christians prayed for the intercessions of Mary throughout their long and arduous campaign before achieving victory. The Most Holy Name of Mary feast day honors Mary, the Mother of God, as blessed. It takes place each year on September 12th, four days after the feast of the Birth of the Blessed Mother. The feast day encourages us all to pray for her intercession to deepen our love of Christ and our relationship with the Lord. **(Oblates of the Virgin Mary website)**
