The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

**FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION:** Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that

### 24nd Sunday of Ordinary Time September 17, 2023

"Peter asked Jesus Lord how many times should I forgive. Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times"

#### First Reading: Sirach 27:30-28:7

Sirach advises all to forgive the faults of their neighbor. Only by forgiving the sins of others, can a person expect to be forgiven his sins.

#### Second Reading: Romans 14:7-9

Paul stresses that no one is his own master; we are responsible to the Lord, and we belong to him in both life and death. **Gospel: Matthew 18:21-35** 

This narrative points out the difference between mercy and justice. When Peter asks how often he should forgive someone who wrongs him, Jesus answers, "...not seven times: I say seventy times seven times." Jesus then narrates the story of the king who was merciful to his official by forgiving him all his debts, but this same official showed no mercy to his own servant.

#### Reflection

Today's Gospel reminds us that love means being willing to forgive many times in life. We fail each other. We sin against each other. Sometimes, we do this deliberately, sometimes thoughtlessly. When we ask God to forgive us our sins, we know they are forgiven. Jesus died for that purpose. But what happens when our peers come forward and ask for our forgiveness? Is forgiveness ever easy? Is it possible that our own greatest sin is our inability to forgive one person in our own lives?

Jesus told Peter that we must forgive seventy-seven times. It was never intended that we keep a ledger, but the main idea is that we forgive over and over. We must remember, when we choose not to forgive is to let anger and wrath poison our hearts and minds. Being unforgiving can imprison a person and us, resulting in bitterness, revenge, and can cause a slow death of the spirit. Not forgiving can be more costly for the one offended.

Paul tells us that we belong to the Lord and are called to serve him, to do his will, which is the will of the Father. And God's will is that we forgive one another. When the risen Lord appeared to his disciples, he wished them peace, and then gave them the power of the Spirit to forgive. This work is not limited to our going to the sacrament of reconciliation.

#### **Pope's Universal Intention:**

Reverend J. Maciej Melaniuk, a retired priest of the diocese. Has passed away on September 9, 2023, in Poland. He was 72 years of age.

Father Melaniuk, a native of Poland, attended Ss. Cyril and Methodius Seminary, Orchard Lake, MI. He was ordained to the priesthood for the Diocese of Metuchen on May 31, He served at Sacred Heart Parish in 1986. South Plainfield, St. Stephen Parish in Perth Amboy, St. Joseph Parish in North Plainfield, Our Lady of Victories Parish in Sayreville, St. Mary of Ostrabrama Parish in South River, and St. Bernard of Clairvaux Parish in Bridgewater. In 1998 he was named Pastor of St. Stephen Protomartyr Parish in South River, and in 2002 was named Pastor of Our Lady of Czestochowa Parish in South Plainfield. In 2016 he became Senior Priest there, and retired from active ministry in 2021.

Father Melaniuk's funeral will take place in Poland. A Memorial Mass will be scheduled at Our Lady of Czestochowa in South Plainfield at a later date.
