FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION: Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.


PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

31st Sunday of Ordinary Time November 5, 2023

"The greatest among you must be your servant."

First Reading: Malachi 1:14b—2:2b, 8-10

This passage from Malachi denounces the laxity and unfaithfulness of the people and especially of the priests, who failed in their duties to God and their neighbors.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 2:7b-9, 13

Paul reminisces about his extremely happy and successful visit with the Thessalonians. He praises them once again for their immediate and open acceptance of his message as truly the word of God.

Gospel: Matthew 23:1-12

In a strongly worded message, Jesus again rebukes the Pharisees for the hypocritical ostentation and love of honor and position. He reminds the people and the disciples that the truly greatest one is the one who serves others. He ends with the words, "Whoever exalts himself shall be humbled, but whoever humbles himself shall be exalted."

Reflection

A friend told me she had been the last in her family to stop going to Mass on Sundays. Her siblings had long since given it up. The reasons had a great deal to do with the quality of the church leadership they experienced. Too much outward show of authority; living humbly and as a servant is the heart of ministry.

The harsh words of the prophet Malachi seem more relevant than ever in our day. When we priests fail to walk in the way of Christ and we fail to give glory to God's name by what we do, we become unworthy of our calling to serve God's people. Of course, this kind of behavior is not limited to clergy. Jesus is speaking to the crowds and disciples about the Pharisees, the lay leaders who saw themselves "separate" from the rest because of their outward signs of piety. He also calls them to authentic lives.

"The greatest among you must be your servant," Jesus says, a message he repeats again and again in the Gospels. His followers are a resistant to it now as they were then. But the faithful follower is not about title, or ecclesiastical dress-up, or posturing in self-importance. Discipleship in the kingdom that Jesus came preaching is about being brothers and sisters who gather around Jesus Christ, the on Master, who humbled himself and waited for God to exalt him. May the same goal be ours.
