MARRIAGES: Specific time is set for the celebration of marriage on Saturdays. The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION: Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

PARISH REGISTRATION: Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph December 31, 2023

Over all [other virtues] put on love, that is, the bond of perfection. — Colossians 3:14

<u>First Reading</u>: Gn 15:1-6, 21:1-3

Abram shows us the Lord keeps His promises, for his offspring were indeed many, like the stars in heaven. We, too, must trust in the Lord, so like Abram, our families might prosper.

Second Reading: Hebrews 11:8, 11-12, 17-19 By faith Abraham and Sarah were blessed with Isaac, and through him, many descendants because they trusted in God's promise and believed in what they could not see. We see that faith, trust and prayer bring forth God's miracles in our lives.

Gospel: Luke 2:22-40

Jesus was brought to Jerusalem to be consecrated according to the law of Moses. A man named Simeon had learned he would not die until he had seen God's anointed. Upon seeing Jesus, he immediately declared he had witnessed "the glory of your people of Israel." The prophetess Anna also gave thanks and spoke of Jesus to all who would listen. Both recognized the power of Jesus, although he was still an infant.

Stewardship Scripture Reflections

Forgiving is one of the hardest things for people to do. We can't give what we don't have. We need to receive God's mercy and forgiveness first before we can give it to others. Reflection

On this day we honor the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. We all belong to families, whether born, married, or adopted into them. We all belong to the family of faith through the waters of baptism and, finally, as part of God's creation, we belong to the larger human family. Not long ago a story was reported about a woman in England. She was retired and lived alone in her modest home. She regularly attended Mass in her local church, but was not involved in parish life. She had one friend, with whom she occasionally had dinner but never invited into her home. According to her only friend, this lady had no birth family or family by marriage left. She spent all her days and evenings shopping. Neighbors who saw her come and go but they formed no connection with her. When they finally noticed that her car had not been moved for days, they called the police. Investigating officers discovered a house filled to the rafters with "stuff." It took them two days to dig through to find the lady who owned it all in a bedroom where heavy boxes had fallen on her and killed her.

This sad story underlines what can happen when we do not have ordinary relationships to sustain us. Almost certainly neighbors and parishioners told themselves after the fact that they could have done something to help. We all know people whose families are deceased or who live far away. Some are outgoing and able to make a network of friends. Others, particularly the frail and elderly, are shy or fearful of bothering anyone. Isolation can have fearful consequences. If, you know someone who is elderly, frail, and isolated, find ways to be a presence and support. We are all God's family as part of his family, we need to help and support each other. Don't let it happen if you can help it.

The devotion involves attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion, and going to Confession on the First Friday of the month for 9 consecutive months. It is a way of showing Love, Penance, and Reparation to Jesus for our sins.
