MARRIAGES: Specific time is set for the celebration of marriage on Saturdays. The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION: Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

PARISH REGISTRATION: Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. ## March 24, 2024 PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

"Christ became obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name."

## First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

Isaiah describes the pain and insults of the Servant of God. Yet he sounds hopeful when describing God as his help, knowing he will not be disgraced.

## Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

Paul exults Christ's great sacrifice of humbling himself to become human and die on the cross. He explains that this is why we should now realize the importance of honoring both his name and memory.

## Gospel: Mark 14:1—15:47

Mark describes the events leading up to Christ's crucifixion. The Last Supper is described, explaining where the Eucharist began. Judas betrays Jesus and his suffering at the hands of the Sanhedrin (Council) is detailed.



The holiest week of the calendar year begins with Palm Sunday. "Holy Week is ordered to the commemoration of Christ's Passion, beginning with his Messianic entrance into Jerusalem". The days of Holy Week, from Monday to Thursday inclusive, have precedence over all other celebrations. It is not fitting, except in the danger of death, that baptisms or confirmations be celebrated on these days since they have their natural place in the Easter Vigil.

## The Easter Triduum: Entering into the Paschal Mystery

The Triduum is the time of the Church year when we celebrate the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.



This three-day celebration begins with the Holy Thursday Mass and continues on Good Friday with the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion. At the end of this liturgy, we leave the church in silence, waiting to celebrate the glory of our Lord's resurrection. Then, on Saturday at sundown, the Church re-gathers to celebrate the final, and most grand moment of the Triduum: the Resurrection of our Lord.

#### THE SIGNIFICANCE OF PALMS



The four gospels in the Bible describe how Christ and his disciples returned to Jerusalem for the Jewish feast of Passover. According to the Bible, Christ entered the city of Jerusalem riding a don-

key, therefore fulfilling a prophecy about the Messiah's arrival.

Crowds of people lined the path he rode, laying down their cloaks in the street in front of him. They also placed palm branches before him-a gesture reserved for only the most honored. They sang praises to Christ, including in those praises "Hosannah," which means "save us now."

#### The Paschal Candle

The Blessing of the Paschal Candle located on the altar is symbolic of the Risen Christ and is lit on the Easter Vigil. It is



placed at the Gospel side of the altar until Ascension Day. It is an ornamental candle with five large grains of incense, representing the wounds of Christ, inserted in the form of a cross. The Greek letters Alpha and Omega, symbolizing Christ as the beginning and the end of all things, are located at the top and bottom of the shaft of the cross. The numbers of the current year of salvation are placed in the quadrants of the cross.

## Everyone bears a cross......

Only by close union with Christ, by devotion to Jesus can we bear our trials with endurance and patience.

Let us borrow some of the love of Jesus, let us partake of His spirit, let us pray often for His help and for an increase in faith.

From disappointments, annoyances and reversals, we learn that we must depend upon God.

Everyone has a cross; we please God in carrying it bravely. Jesus will not let it go beyond our endurance. Carrying our cross purifies our soul, teaches us compassion, make us gracious in victory and gives us humility.

When Christ was nailed to the cross, jeered at by the hooting crowd, He said, "FATHER, FORGIVE THEM, THEY KNOW NOT WHAT THEY DO." Every day of your life persevere in prayer, for to neglect this duty is like a soldier going into battle without a weapon—a mere target for the enemy. Jesus in His thirty years in Nazareth teaches us that to God, things do not depend upon the amount one accomplishes.

Death is but a brief sleep to wake up with Christ. Death is the birthday of the soul.
