The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION: Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

PARISH REGISTRATION: Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SEPTEMBER 21, 2025

"The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones."

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Amos 8:4-7

The prophet Amos expressed disgust over people who take advantage of the poor. He describes businessmen scheming to cheat the poor, then declares that God will "never forget the things they have done."

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 2:1-8

Paul urges the Christians to pray for all people, especially those in authority. Paul even asked them to pray for the kings who denounced Christ's teachings, because God wants all people to be saved through Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 16:1-13

Jesus tells a story about a servant who tries to cheat his employer. The owner is impressed because he would do the same thing himself. Jesus then describes the importance of being trustworthy in small matters, as well as in greater ones. He then states that no one can serve two masters faithfully,

St. Pius of Pietrelcina-"Padre Pio" "Give us Jesus always du

"Give us Jesus always during our brief stay in this land of exile."

"Padre Pio" was born Francesco Forgione in 1887 in the Italian village of Pietrelcina. He was a Capuchin priest who received the stigmata, the wounds of Christ, and spent fifty years at the monastery of San Giovanni Rotondo, where he was sought after as a spiritual advisor, confessor, and intercessor. He was so renowned for his holiness and intense spiritual insights that he would often spend up to 16 hours a day hearing the confessions of the crowds of people who waited for days to see him. His life was devoted to the Eucharist and to prayer. He died in 1968 and was canonized by Pope John Paul II on June 16, 2002. Source: ORDO; Padre Pio Foundation of America


