MARRIAGES: Specific time is set for the celebration of marriage on Saturdays. The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION: Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

PARISH REGISTRATION: Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. Please call or stop by the Parish office to complete a registration form. We should also be notified if your address has changed or if you are leaving the parish..

"Take these out of here and stop making my Father's house a marketplace."

THE DEDICATION of THE LATERAN BASILICA

First Reading: Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

This reading from the Prophet Ezekiel tells of the streaming, healing waters that flow from the temple. These waters restore life to the river's inhabitants as well as the fruit bearing trees along its banks. It is believed that the water signifies blessings, whereas the lack of signifies trouble, hardship.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 3:9c-11, 16-17

Paul compares us to a building whose foundation has been laid by Jesus. As the people of God, we can only be solid if we are grounded in Christ.

Gospel: John 2:13-22

Near the time of Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem and saw the temple had become a marketplace. He became angry and proceeded to drive out the vendors and livestock. Jesus spoke of destroying the temple and rebuilding it in three days. The Jews did not know Jesus was speaking of his body, but when his resurrection from the dead came to pass, his disciples remembered what Jesus had said and came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

The Lateran Basilica, known officially as the Papal Archbasilica of Saint John Lateran, is the cathedral church of the Diocese of Rome and the official ecclesiastical seat of the Pope.



The oldest of Rome's four Major Basilicas, it is ranked first among them, and is sometimes referred to as the "Mother of all Churches". It contains significant artistic elements, including the Holy Stairs (Scala Sancta).

Built by Emperor Constantine the Great in the 4th century, it was originally donated to the Pope. It served for a time as the papal residence before it moved to the Vatican.

The basilica remains the mother church of the Catholic Church worldwide and the Pope's cathedral.

Holy Thursday Mass is celebrated here by the Pope as the Bishop of Rome. Commonly called St. John Lateran, it was originally dedicated to Christ the Savior. The St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist dedications were added later.


There is a \$70 fee to take the exam and there is NO make-up date.
