MARRIAGES: Specific time is set for the celebration of marriage on Saturdays. The common Policy for all the Dioceses of New Jersey requires a period of preparation for the sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the parish priest and attendance at either the Pre-Cana conferences or the Engaged Encounter Weekend. Therefore, arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance and before any social plans are finalized.

FIRST PENANCE, FIRST EUCHARIST, CONFIRMATION: Though immediate preparation is given to children before receiving these sacraments, it is expected that children receive a Christian education within their family life, through formal religious education classes, and by attending Sunday worship services.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Arrangements for Communion Calls to the sick at home may be made by calling the Parish Office.

PARISH REGISTRATION: Our parish welcomes new members to our faith community. Catholic persons new to our area must complete a registration form and be interviewed by the pastor. OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE **NOVEMBER 23, 2025**

"Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST. KING OF THE UNIVERSE

First Reading: 2 Samuel 5:1-3

Samuel describes how all the tribes of Israel went to David in Hebron and said they were his bone and his flesh and it was he who led them back to Israel. The Lord told David he would be a shepherd to His people. David made an agreement with the elders and was anointed king.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:12-20

Paul explains to the Colossians that God has made them fit to share in the inheritance of the holy ones in light and that through the Son we have redemption and forgiveness of sin. He describes Jesus as the image of the invisible God, the head of the church and in Him all things hold together.

Gospel: Luke 23:35-43

Jesus is mocked by the crowd as he hung on the cross. Above him was an inscription that read "This is the king of the Jews." One of the men being crucified with Jesus tells Him to save them and Himself, while the other asks that he be remembered when Jesus is in his kingdom. Jesus said in reply, "Amen I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."



The solemnity of Christ the King was established by Pius XI in 1925 and, after the Second Vatican Council, it was placed at the close of the Liturgical year.

The Gospel according to St. Luke presents, as in a great painting, the **Kingship of Jesus** at the moment of His crucifixion. The leaders of the people and the soldiers taunt 'the firstborn of all creation' and put Him to the test to see whether He has the power to save Himself from death. Yet precisely on the cross, Jesus is exalted to the very "height" of the God who is Love. It is there that He can be "known".

Jesus gives us life because He gives us God. He can give God because He himself is one with God. From the One who "is before all things, and in Him all things hold together," the so-called "Good Thief" straightaway receives forgiveness and the joy of entering the kingdom of heaven...Jesus, from the throne of the cross, welcomes every human being With infinite mercy." November The Month of the Holy Souls

In the heart of autumn, as the leaves turn to vibrant shades of red and gold, a solemn and sacred season begins in the Catholic calendar: the **Month of the Holy Souls**, also known as the **Month of All Souls**.

Every November offers us a time of deep reflection, prayer and remembrance for the faithful. It is a period when we can come together to honor and pray for the souls of the departed, particularly those who may still be in purgatory, awaiting their entry into the eternal glory of heaven.

Central to the **Month of Holy Souls** is the concept of *purgatory*, which suggests a state or place where souls are purified before entering heaven. Purgatory is understood as a temporary state of suffering and purification, during which the souls of the deceased are cleansed of their sins and made fit for the eternal presence of God.


